We all experience the Sacraments differently, we bring with us our own life's experiences and our own perceptions as we receive the Sacraments.

Sacraments are never what we know or feel about God, they are gifts given to us freely. Sacraments are for the people of God who are on a journey

- --- they are like stepping-stones
- ---they enable us to be in communion with God.
- ---they allow us to have a working and loving relationship with God, no matter what stage of our journey we are on.

Sacraments allow a person to enter into a religious dimension of human existence and to experience the sacred.

Sacramental ceremonies are recognized by those who participate in the rituals and rites as something that brings about some change in their lives and that change involves God.

In our secular ceremonies like graduation, marriage, or a. promotion at work. It changes our lives and puts us in a different dimension.

Three main features of a sacramental experience are:

Sacred Space, this space is different from ordinary space.

Sacred Time, is experienced during prayer, Mass, when we are gathered together.

Sacred Meaning, what we experience when we receive the Body of Christ.
