Dear Members of St. Joseph's Parish,

This past week a group of committed young men and women, part of NET (National Evangelization Team), came to our parish to lead a retreat for our Confirmation class of 2011, and to give a shorter retreat to the Confirmation class of 2012.

With reason I can say that, in my experience, I have not yet witnessed such a powerful retreat, and the tremendous spiritual uplift it gave to our young parishioners, enabling them to open up to the Holy Spirit and experience God's presence and love in a way perhaps that had not been part of their lives before. Most of the Confirmation class students (Year 1 & 2) took the opportunity to go to confession. For many, it was the first time they had been since their First Holy Communion, which means it was only their second time ever going to confession. Obviously we can never discuss what was said in confession, but let me say that all of the youth truly experienced the power of repentance and forgiveness.

This is the second year we have availed of the NET team ministry, out of Minnesota, and it seems to be the way to go. I am extremely pleased with the work that Delmo and Annie Andreozzi contribute to the Confirmation program, and that of course includes the many volunteers who assist them faithfully. Our young parishioners are well-served!

The Knights of Columbus were very visible during the retreat weekend, especially in providing delicious meals. The Knights have also been active in other projects supporting the RCIA program with better facilities, and doing practical work in the church and other buildings. We are blessed with their commitment to us, as well as the support of the Ladies Auxiliary.

As you know, Lent is rather late this year. That makes me real happy as last year it seemed we were just getting over Christmas when Lent began, early.

The Ash Wednesday schedule, and Stations of the Cross schedule, is published in this week's bulletin. One addition this year is that we are adding an additional weekday Mass throughout the season of Lent. Our extra Mass will be on Tuesday evenings, at 6:00pm, beginning March 15, (the Tuesday following Ash Wednesday). The hope is that many who cannot attend the midday Masses might avail of this opportunity, as well as families whose children come to CCD on that afternoon and evening.

Finally, may I please encourage you to participate in the bishop's appeal, the Catholic Services Appeal. We have completed our two weekend presentations, and now it is in your hands. As I explained, my great hope is that we can increase the number of families participating. Last year, our participation, at just 14%, was the lowest in the diocese. Your participation, more than the dollar amount you pledge, is most important.

### LENTEN REGULATIONS

**Catholics between the ages of 18 & 59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday & Good Friday. In addition, all Catholics 14 years old and older must abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday & all the Fridays of Lent.**

**Fasting means partaking of only one full meal. Some food (not equaling another full meal) is permitted at breakfast & around midday or in the evening.**

**Abstinence forbids the use of meat, but not of eggs, milk products or condiments made of animal fat.**

**Abstinence does not include meat juices & liquid foods made from meat. Such foods as chicken broth, consomme, soups cooked or flavored with meat, meat gravies or sauces, as well as seasonings or condiments made from animal fat are not forbidden. So it is permissible to use margarine & lard. Even bacon drippings which contain little bits of meat may be poured over lettuce as seasoning.**
